Alta Gracia and the Boise State Women's Center are offering an experience that will teach viewers about free trade and fair working conditions in clothing factories. Alta Gracia is a brand of t-shirts, sweatshirts and hoodies on college campuses all over the country that offers students, their families, and alumni the opportunity to give the workers that sew their clothing a pathway out of poverty.

Audience members will get a chance to see first-hand what life in these factories is like. This is achieved through the use of a "Virtual Worker Tour" which is a group Skype video call that allows you to meet the women of the Villa Alta Gracia factory in the Dominican Republic.

The BSU bookstore is already selling clothing from Alta Gracia, and this is a great way to show support of these products. This event is free to all faculty, students, and staff, and all bookstore employees are encouraged to attend as well!
