

Two Important Notes From Christy:

Note 1, for all SACM-sponsored students -- As you probably know, Boise State recently met with representatives from SACM to discuss how we can better help the Saudi students be successful at Boise State. One of the things that we agreed to do is supply SACM with an official transcript for each student at the end of each semester. This is one of SACM's requirements for you as a sponsored student. But, in order to do that, I need you to sign a Release of Information form. These forms are located in the International Student Services office at the reception desk. This should make it easier for you—you won't have to worry about ordering a transcript or sending your class schedule each semester—we'll do it for you! But—1) we MUST have the Release of Information form signed (and at least bullet points 2, 3, & 4 checked), and 2) you must not have any holds on your school account at the end of the semester. So - PLEASE - come to International Student Services and sign the form!

Note 2, for Everyone -- From Diana Fairchild: as I get ready to help a new class of international students, I would really like some feedback from you as to what classes (and instructors) you would recommend for new students. The deadline for filing your tax return this year is April 18th.


