PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS PROGRAM

**WHAT THE HECK IS PSP
ANYWAY?**

PSP (Professional Standards Program) is a way we can monitor our growth and professional development. PSP points are accrued by assigning values to the number of years in our profession, education that we have received, and professional activity.

The number of years of experience is derived by awarding ten points for every year in an educational setting and ten points for every two years of experience in a non-educational office. Teaching is also awarded by ten points for every year of experience.

Educational points are granted for courses taken in the required areas:

- ◆ Business
- ◆ Business Administration
- ◆ Communication/Media
- ◆ Computer Science
- ◆ Cultural/Historical
- ◆ Education
- ◆ Engineering
- ◆ Health/Physical Education
- ◆ Language
- ◆ Management
- ◆ Mathematics
- ◆ Science
- ◆ Social Science

Service points are granted for the number of years of membership in the local, state, and national associations; for offices held in these associations, memberships on committees, chairing committees, and workshops you may have given.

Inservice training points are given for conferences, conventions, institutes, noncredit courses, and workshops attended. All of our BSUAOP monthly workshops have been approved by the National PSP Registrar for PSP credit.

There are two options for receiving your PSP. Option I and Option II each have three levels of certification. Option II requires more formal training than Option I.

Dates for filing: The dates for returning your PSP applications are September 1, January 15, and May 15. The application fee is \$35 for PSP certification; \$35 to upgrade your certificate (i.e. from Advanced I to Advanced II); and \$55 for CEOE certification.

CEOE Certification is granted after completion of the highest level of Option I or Option II.

A PSP certificate is not so much so that others can see what we have accomplished as it is for us to measure and celebrate our growth.
