PROGRAM NOTES

Beethoven — Mass in C, Opus 86, composed in 1807, first performed at Palace of Count Esterhazy, Haydn's patron. Published in 1812 and dedicated to Prince Ferdinand Kinsky. This Mass was commissioned and caused postponement of the 5th Symphony. The work was written in 2 months and made very little impression as musicians felt that "Beethoven could not contrive choruses with rounded effects and singable solos". Beethoven was 37 at the time of this composition.
