Vif Modere Brazileira JAMES HOPPER, a graduate of Juilliard School, University of Iowa, and Washington State University, is principal clarinetist with the Boise Philharmonic and the Boise City Band. He has performed as soloist with various orchestras throughout the Northwest. He was 1970 recipient of the Governor's Medal of Honor in Arts and Humanities; on Sun Valley Music Faculty for many years. He is teaching clarinet and wind ensemble at Boise State College. He studied with Professor Corrodo Sarri in Florence, Italy.

MADELEINE HSU studied with Cortot, Kempff, and Lhevinne; a graduate from the Juilliard School with the Josef Lhevinne Memorial Award, she won many prizes in international competitions in Europe and South America and commendatory press reviews during her tours. She was soloist in important programs in New York, including TV NBC, Channel 4 and the Festival of Contemporary South American Music. She is teaching piano at Boise State College. She is scheduled for a concert with orchestra in Paris.

WILLIAM HSU, a graduate from Nanking University and Brussels Royal Conservatory, studied with Crickboom and Wagemans. For the past fourteen years, he has been teaching violin, viola and chamber music at the Mannes College of Music in New York; he was professor in the viola department at the Usdan Center, New York, and principal violist in New York orchestras. He is teaching violin and viola at Boise State College. He is scheduled for a solo recital in Paris.

RONALD ITAMI, student of James Hopper, is a clarinet major at Boise State College. He is a member of the College's band and orchestra. He will join Carol March and the Hsus in concert at the Paris American Academy.

CAROL MARCH, student of Richard Skyrm and Fern Davidson at the College of Idaho, is a senior at Boise State College where she prepares a B.M. with Madeleine Hsu. Staff planist and recent soloist with the Boise Philharmonic, she was faculty accompanist and teacher at Sun Valley Music Camp for six year. As a senior, she will play with the Boise State College orchestra in April, 1972. She is scheduled for a concert at the Paris American Academy.
