The Boise Junior college choir will take its annual tour April 8, 9 and 10. On Wednesday, April 8, the group will present a program in Kuna at 9 o'clock a.m. At 11:00 they will travel to Nampa, then they will conclude their Wednesday program in Caldwell at 2 o'clock.

On Thursday, the choir will sing in Meridian at 9 o'clock a.m., Emmett at 11 a.m., and will then proceed to McCall where they will present an evening concert at the First Congregational church. Solo numbers in this program will be sung by Rex Frazer, Sid Nelson and Sharon White. Marvin Gardner will be sound effects man for the group's novelty numbers.

The choir will spend Thursday night in McCall at Shore Lodge. In concluding their tour Friday, the group will sing in New Meadows at 9:30 a.m., Cambridge at 1:00 and in Weiser at 3:00 p.m.

All of the concerts given during the tour will be in high schools except in Nampa, where it will be held at NNC and in McCall at the First Congregational church.

On April 12, at 4:30 p.m., the choir will give its spring concert in the BJC auditorium. Miss Snodgrass will present several piano selections in this program.

Four weeks following their spring concert, the choir will again sing at the dedication ceremonies for the new organ in the BJC auditorium.

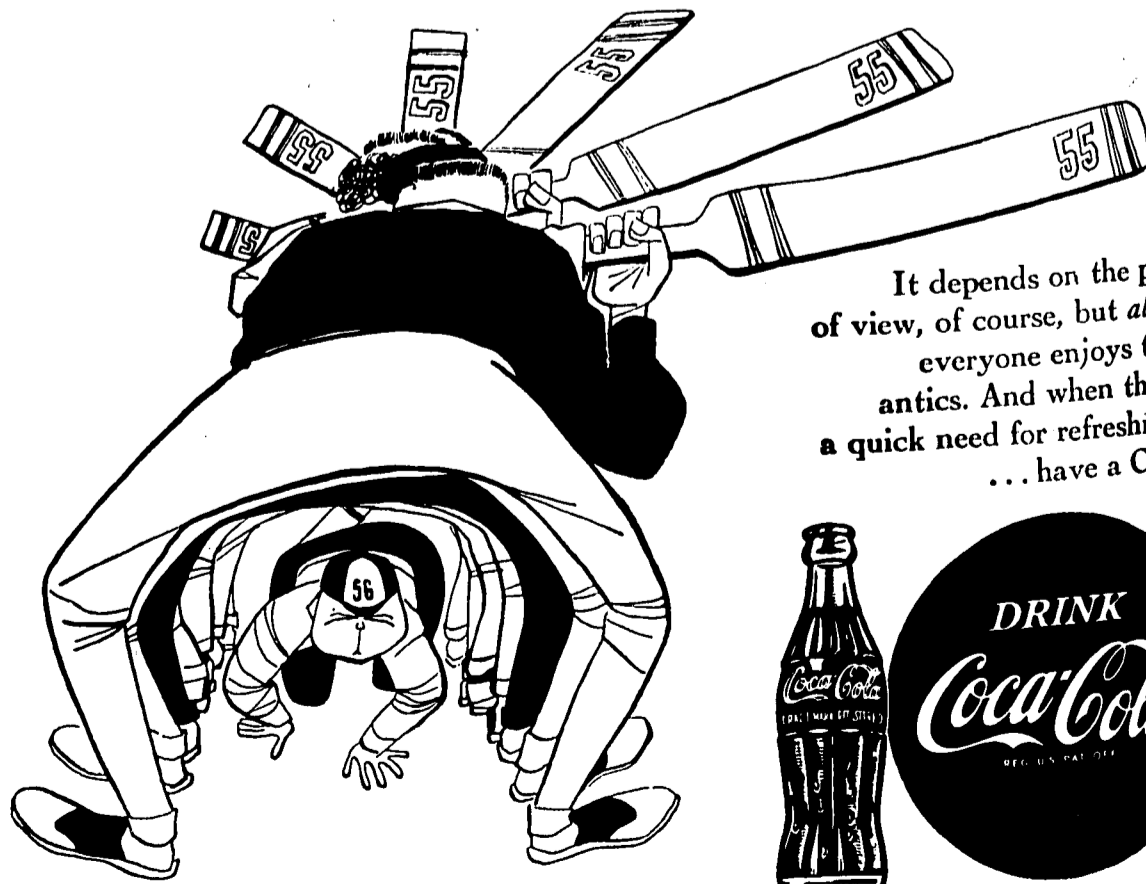
